




# BEING A PART OF GOD'S WELCOME GREETERS, USHERS AND YOU!

How important are these ministries?

- 1. Greeters, Ushers, Security and YOU are ministers of hospitality.
- 2. Greeters and Ushers have a very public ministry which profoundly affects the quality of each worship experience.
- 3. Both roles play a vital role in the long-term health of the church. (Guests have the ability to detect lack of sincerity in the people they encounter. Newcomers decide in the first 5 minutes whether to return.)
- 4. Greeters and Ushers are expected to participate in worship.
- 5. Greeters and Ushers behavior before, during and after the service communicates information about the church to guests.
- 6. Good hospitality does not simply happen it is prayed for, planned for, organized, evaluated and celebrated.
- 7. Greeters, Ushers and Security Staff need to be identified clearly Blue Vests are available on Sunday morning and all should wear a vest throughout the morning.
- 8. Positive eye contact and a smile should greet each person new or returning.
- 9. Greeters and Ushers are not expected to know everyone. If a person is not known to you, offer this simple introduction, "Welcome! My name is \_\_\_\_\_. I'm not sure we have met before." Follow the introduction with "Are you new to town," or How did you hear about Anderson First UMC?"
- 10.Introduce guests to other members of the congregation.
- 11. Direct persons with questions to the Welcome Center or a pastor.
- 12. Hand them one of Pastor Corinne's business cards on the Welcome Center (in the usher's closet for your pockets!).
- 13. Greeters are the first members of the congregation that people meet upon arrival at church.
- 14. Ushers are the first representative of Christ for a worship service.

- 3. Worship at an individual time at AFUMC downtown building/sanctuary.
- 4. Share ministry resources people & finances.
- j. Create a 5-year Ministry/Budget Plan. This includes what ministries we envision and the resources staff and financial needed to achieve the plan.
- k. Create stewardship awareness and motivation: monthly Glimpse of Giving moment in worship by members of the congregation.
- I. Stewardship Campaign theme "Rooted in Love" begins Sept. 18 October 9. Pitch-in meal will follow worship to conclude the celebration

# **ADAPT REPORT September 2022**

#### 1. HOSPITALITY FOCUS

- A. Hospitality Training: Equip the congregation, greeters, ushers and security staff for Sunday morning hospitality and ways to effectively connect guests to more than worship.
- B. Congregational Care Team has launched as of Jan. 30, 2022 with these ministries with current members:
  - i. Care Connections
    - 1. Those unable to join in person gatherings (shut-ins) coordinated by Pastor Don Deena; Vicki Snyder & Betsy Bachman; Ida Campbell sending cards
- ii. Prayer Bear ministry is a simple way to offer care, compassion, and connection to those hurting emotionally and physically.
- iii. Continue weekly postcards, JOY lunches, Bon Amis trips
- c. Engaged Gateway families and staff in summer 2022 with sack suppers in June and July 2022.
- d. Advertise in Herold Bulletin Full page advertisement is about \$750 Outdoor Summer Worship at Davis Park in June (May Ad.); will submit an Advent & Christmas Events Advertisement (Dec. 1 Ad.)
- e. Expand our online connections. Tom Shriver-McGrevy has set up online prayer requests on our website; Tom will continue and Pastor Peggy will connect regularly through Instagram; exploring additional ways to offer ways for online worshipers to give.
- 2. FAITH DEVELOPMENT FOCUS
  - a. Worship
  - b. Sermon Talk-Back (Pastor Don Deena)
  - c. Develop additional Sunday morning small groups (Sunday School) for Bible Study.
  - d. Establish a long-term Bible Study group (i.e. Disciple Bible Study).
  - e. Develop additional weekday small groups for Bible Study
  - f. Prayer
    - i. Develop online Prayer Request collection and response.
    - ii. Maintain the Christian Service (Outreach) ministries currently thriving
    - iii. Offer a Prayer Table at the YMCA. Pastor Corinne is in conversation with the YMCA leadership and Board.
- 3. FINANCE FOCUS
  - a. Continue to monitor the financial health of the congregation through monthly Finance Committee reports.
  - b. Treasurers Report will be included in monthly VOICE beginning Oct. 2022.
  - c. Creatively encourage stewardship & financial giving among all members & affiliates even those connecting online
    - i. Explore "Text" giving
    - ii. Explore placing a kiosk in the building
  - d. Legacy Seminar continues encouraging person to include the church in their will and estate planning as endowments. Next free opportunity
  - to learn is Tuesday, Sept. 27 at 6 p.m. in NS Parlor.
  - e. Review staff positions, job descriptions and resources vs. needs. Propose recommended changes. Begin by re-acquainting congregation with staff – monthly staff highlight in newsletter.

On the first and third Sundays of the month, one of our cooking teams will prepare a hot meal for our guests. On the second, fourth and occasional fifth Sundays, donuts, coffee and hot chocolate will be provided in the narthex and each guest will receive a bag of groceries. Every Sunday will be an opportunity for our neighbors to come inside, warm-up, and linger awhile in a safe and welcoming space.
