#### **ASH WEDNESDAY**

#### WHY DO WE PUT ASHES ON OUR FOREHEADS?

Ashes are a biblical reminder of our mortality: "You are dust, and to dust you shall return" (Genesis 3:19). The spreading of ashes on foreheads is a visible reminder of this. The way to Easter is the way of the cross. "Do you not know that all of us who have been baptized into Christ Jesus were baptized into his death?" (Romans 6:3). New life with Christ involves a daily surrendering of the old life. Ash Wednesday, the first step of this Lenten journey, invites us to acknowledge our mortality and our sinfulness by the imposition of ashes.

Ah! The joy of music! Whether exhilarating, comforting, calming or creating joy, it is something we all share. I am blessed to be in the position of Director of Music and Organist

In my role as Director of Music, I create the music schedule – which group will share their gifts each Sunday morning. I do this for three "seasons" of the year September-December, January-May, June-August. I contact the director or individual to arrange each schedule. Our church is enormously blessed with talented individuals and ensembles giving us a wide range of musical styles to enhance our worship each week.

In addition to scheduling various groups, I spend a lot of time listening to music from different publishing houses to choose music that is well suited to that specific season such as Advent or Lent. I place orders for new music or choose songs from our church library. I plan for weekly rehearsals held with the choir from late August to early May.

I am responsible for planning for two special services each year – Lessons and Carols and Good Friday. I also hire extra musicians throughout the year as needed- Return Sunday, Ash Wednesday and Lesson and Carols. As organist, I also work to choose music that fits a particular time of year

As organist, I also work to choose music that fits a particular time of yea and works with the themes of the service whenever possible. I practice several hours each week.

In addition to leading the overall music program, I also play in Wesley Handbells, Handbell Quartet, and Joyful Jazz. I also work on a Community Café team.

I would be remiss not to mention my deep gratitude for the other members of the music "team" who help bring great quality music each week: Sarah Taylor, conductor of Wesley Bells, Mark Finger, founder and conductor of Alpha Brass, and Chris Taylor, director of Joyful Jazz, and Mark and Michele Murray who share their gifts throughout the year.

I especially want to acknowledge Michele whose outstanding musicianship is a gift for us all

I am grateful for the words of kindness and support I receive throughout the year!
