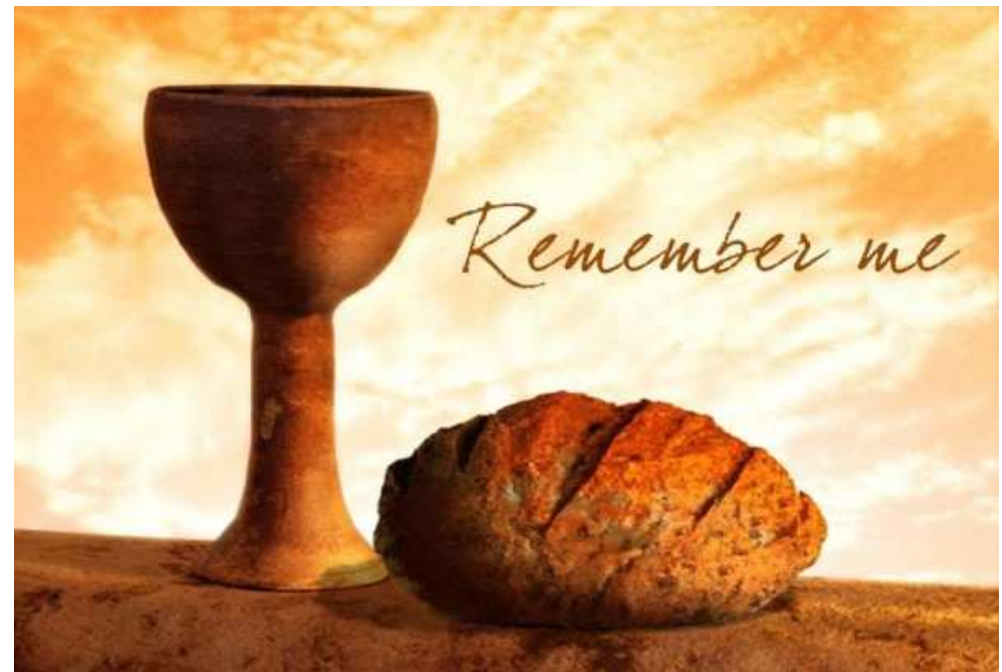

COMMUNION LITANY

What we are about to do in our worship, gracious God, has many layers of meaning and many names;

Whatever we call it, its meaning is summed up in the earliest creed of your Son's church, "Jesus Christ is Lord!"

We speak of the service as the Last Supper because it was Christ's last supper with his disciples where the Master broke the bread and poured the wine.

We also call our action the Lord's Supper – Jesus was the Host then. Jesus is the Host today.

Our worship is known as Holy Communion. It was His prayer that we should all be one in Him and that our unity in him should transcend all barriers.

It offers us a foretaste of the feast, which your faithful people look forward to enjoying with your Son in heaven.

And sometimes we call this act of worship simply the sacrament, like baptism it seals us as the Body of Christ.

This action is a sign of our allegiance to our Lord, repeated frequently for our nurture and growth in faith.

Loving God, as we approach our Lord's Table, we pray for the unity and peace of his worldwide church.

For the well-being and effective witness of this congregation as we Journey to Hope.

We gather around his table hungry for the Bread of Life that only Christ can provide.
