INSPIRATIONS

APRIL DEVOTION by Steve Anderson

"May the God of hope fill you with all joy and peace." Romans 15:13
"Consider the lilies of the field and how they grow..." Matthew 6:28

As March and its Ides fade into the past the fresh start of hope and the resurrection of new life emerges signaling that it is April.

God's awakening of the earth by clothing the stark nakedness of winter with the lilies of the field is evidence that resurrection is indeed a part of life. Later in the summer God offers further evidence by giving us surprise lilies. They just pop up one day and then are gone in two or three days.

My first experience with spring and the spirituality of it occurred when I was maybe three years old. There were concrete steps from our back porch and at my age they were very steep. I carefully, with a fair amount of trepidation, slowly began the decent on all fours. At the bottom was the yard. The morning sun was bright. My eyes settled on a large dandelion in full bloom. It was surrounded by green grass glistening from the morning dew.

In this moment of the discovery of spring I also felt very connected to that flower and grass not realizing that I was also connecting to God. April is also remembered for being the month that Nazi concentration camps were discovered and liberated by the Allies in 1945. The first of these camps, Auschwitz, was liberated by Soviet troops January 27, 1945. Over six million people were systematically executed for just being who they were as created by God.

Putting aside all speculation of what happens after death one only needs to relive the Easter story and the death of Jesus Christ and His resurrection from that dark moment. Two billion people as Christians have found the answer.

My favorite account of Jesus revealing himself after the resurrection occurred by him standing on the shore of Galilee shouting to the disciples who were fishing "have you caught anything" They replied "No" Jesus then said, "throw your net on the other side of the boat". They did and the net filled with fish.

He then said come ashore and have some breakfast. They cooked some of the fish and then Jesus tested their commitment to the daunting task at hand of spreading the Gospel to the world.

The topics of faith and courage to represent Jesus were discussed. When you go fishing you really believe you are going to catch a fish. When you don't ,your faith will sustain you.

Harland Sanders' life was filled with failure and rejection, but he carried on with a steadfast belief that his idea for a secret fried chicken recipe would be accepted by someone. His idea was rejected 1008 times but on the 1009 time it was accepted.

During the Easter season we meditate on Jesus' ministry, striving to follow His example and teachings. As an example, Anderson First UMC supports External Ministry programs. We will be sending an Easter letter providing a list of our external ministry programs being supported by our Easter donations this year. As far as our internal ministries, Community Cafe and Food at First have been transitioning this winter. We have had unpredictable numbers due to local Warming Shelters which also provided meals in addition to a warm overnight stay. With their closures, we had 91 guests Sunday.
