NATIONAL MENTAL HEALTH MONTH

"Because we Care like Christ."

May is Mental Health Awareness Month, an annual observance founded by Mental Health America in 1949 to highlight the importance of mental wellbeing, educate the public, reduce stigma and promote support for those affected by mental health conditions. Each year, individuals and organizations come together to raise awareness and advocate for better mental health care and resources. Despite progress in mental health initiatives, more than 30 million people in the U.S. still lack access to comprehensive, high-guality care.

> These statistics highlight the ongoing need for Mental Health Awareness Month:

1 in 5 U.S. adults experience mental illness each year.

1 in 20 U.S. adults experience serious mental illness each year.

1 in 6 U.S. youth have a mental health condition, but only half receive treatment.

50% of all lifetime mental illness begins by age 14, and 75% by age 24.

In 2022, 22% of high school students seriously considered suicide in the past year.

Outreach Ministries OUTREACH NEWS

A big "Thank You" to Alpha Brass for their generous contribution after their concert. What a blessing to receive over \$400.00 for the Outreach Ministry and what a timely gift indeed.

We transition to the Community Grille June 1 and continue through July and August.

This is our mostly costly and most well-attended food event, as you can imagine. We provide one clamshell with a choice of hamburger or cheeseburger and hot dog, chips, dessert and bottled water. Last year, we combined 2 sandwiches in one clamshell in order to be more cost effective and environmentally friendly. We also transitioned from Gatorade to bottled water. A grocery bag is no longer provided at this time.

These changes were made in order to keep within a reasonable budget and to provide the meat not otherwise available on Sunday nights in our community. Thank you for your continued support and prayers.

Council of Bishops of The United Methodist Church Letter to Catholics on the Death of Pope Francis

April 22, 2025

Dear Catholic Brothers and Sisters,

As United Methodists, we join with you in mourning the death of Pope Francis. We share in the assurance that Pope Francis has entered into eternal rest, having heard the words of our Lord Jesus, "Well done, my good and faithful servant, well done." (Matthew 25:21)

We remember Pope Francis for his remarkable witness to the love and mercy of Christ. His deep spirituality, and commitment to peace, justice, and compassion has left a lasting legacy of holiness living. The theme of mercy was central to his life and ministry, particularly in his concern for those who have been excluded, marginalized, exploited, and oppressed.

We are inspired by his passion for caring for the earth. We celebrate his commitment to promoting ecumenism. Pope Francis welcomed leaders of different confessions and denominations, and his support for ecumenical work has fostered greater understanding and cooperation among Christians. His leadership style, marked by a Christ-like sensitivity toward others and a willingness to address controversial issues, is a powerful example for us all. The process of synodality he promoted is an inspiration to Methodists, who have valued the importance of holy conferencing in our own tradition.
